Executive Summary

Michael E. Smith Middle School is a 5-8 public school that is a part of the South Hadley Public School System. Michael E. Smith Middle School has robust offerings from core academics such as English, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies to Arts opportunities, Student Council, and a large variety of After School programs.

The enrollment is currently 532 students who are served by a staff consisting of 2 administrators, 3 counselors, 32 academic teachers, 10 special education teachers, 2 specialists, 25 paraprofessionals, 3 administrative assistants, 4 custodians, and 4 cafeteria staff.

Data as a Point of Reference

Michael E. Smith Middle School currently uses one form of common data across all 4 grades, MCAS. MCAS data from 2017 to 2021 (excluding 2020), indicates that students at MESMS consistently meet or exceed expectations in ELA and Mathematics at a rate below the state average. This data is central to the goal of academic rigor.

The March, 2022 Climate Survey posed questions that gave insight into students' social relationships and emotional well being. The data gathered indicates that while students have strong group identities, the groups seem to have weaker relationships between each other. As we begin to implement our district and individual school improvement plans, strengthening interpersonal relationships and the sense of a shared community will be important areas of our focus.
